- Number of students in PG classes is very less.

- **Opportunities**

- Faculty can contribute more in publication of books/journal articles.
- At present Punjabi Sahit Sabha conducts only competitions for students. Efforts may be made to publish the works of the students in various magazines.
- Teaching of Punjabi may be made occupation-oriented.

- **Challenges**

- A number of other institutions in the adjoining area have been offering Masters Courses in Punjabi.
- It is a challenge to keep the interest of the students intact in the Punjabi language keeping in mind the fact that they have an increasing interest in the other foreign languages.

- The Department must work for increasing the use of ICT enabled teaching.
- The Department should perform a lead role in sensitizing the students towards Punjabi culture, language and traditions.
